<p>The Prevention of Crime and Disorder</p>	<p>On 25/11/19 an allegation was received directly into Immigration Enforcement stating there was illegal working taking place at the above named takeaway. The allegation provided in depth details of the illegal worker such as: his full name, date of birth, nationality, place of birth, mobile number, how long he had been working illegally at the premises for and his working hours/days. Specifically it said:-</p> <p>[REDACTED]</p> <p>Research was conducted on this information on Home Office systems which showed:-</p> <p>[REDACTED] <i>has a record with Immigration Enforcement showing he was served with official paperwork on 17/03/18 notifying him he was an Overstayer in the UK due to his visa running out on 08/04/17 as he had failed to leave the UK by then. To date he has not sought to regularise his stay in the UK. He also has no permission to work in the UK. A photo was held of [REDACTED] to assist with his identification.</i></p> <p>A decision was taken on 17/12/19 by the Yorkshire &amp; Humberside ICE team to investigate the allegation by conducting a visit to the premises. The date for the visit was set for 11/01/20.</p> <p>On 11/01/20 at approx. 21:50hrs, a team of Immigration Officers attended at Chicken Stop, 5 Grimsby Road, Cleethorpes, DN357AQ. A warrant to enter the premises was held; issued by Hull Magistrates Court on 09/01/20. Upon entry, [REDACTED] was identified standing behind the serving counter, at the cash till on the phone. He was spoken to by officers and stated he was not working at the takeaway; he was there to cook some food for his girlfriend. The owner of the takeaway was spoken to by officers and stated that [REDACTED] had been helping out there answering the phone for over 6 months and did this for 3-4 hours as and when required for £7 per hour in cash.</p>

	<p>As a result of this information, the owner of the takeaway was served with a Referral Notice advising him that he was being referred for consideration of liability for a civil penalty as it was suspected that illegal working was taking place at the takeaway.</p> <p>On 04/02/20 a decision was made by the Civil Penalty Team, part of the Home Office to issue a civil penalty of £10,000 to The Chicken Stop in relation to [REDACTED] who had no right to work or to undertake the work in question.</p>
