HWBB.14 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence for this meeting were received from Councillor Lindley.

HWBB.15 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest received in respect of any item on the agenda for this meeting.

HWBB. 16 COVID-19

The board heard a verbal on the latest COVID-19 epidemiology, recovery plan and outbreak management plan across North East Lincolnshire.

Members queried if a mass vaccination centre was set up in North East Lincolnshire Council would it speed up the vaccination programme. Mr Pintus explained that it was the supply of the vaccines and the storage of the Pfizer one that restricted the mobility of the roll out. He confirmed that once there was an increase in supplies, the vaccine roll out programme could be accelerated. Mr Pinus highlighted that when the priority groups had been vaccinated and it was extended to the wider population, where there would be considerably more people, that was when the judgement would need to be made about a mass vaccine centre. Ms Kenyon confirmed that they were working through the numbers at present to be better informed on the mass vaccine centre. Mr Pintus confirmed that there would be more communication required at that stage to encourage people in the lower age bands to receive the vaccine.

Members referred to the higher number of working age population getting covid and asked what was the percentage of health and social care workers? Mr Pintus explained that the quality of the data from the national contact trace system around job roles was not clear because the field that was entered onto the system with this information could be left blank if people preferred not to say.

Mr Walsh referred to the numbers of people with covid across North East Lincolnshire however he felt that complacency remained the biggest risk and highlighted the importance of the communication of the fundamentals which were still around hands, face, space, testing and isolation.

Mr Leake offered support around the use of the fire authority estates if required which was welcomed by the board.
