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**STATEMENT OF  
ALISON KATE SAXBY**

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**Introduction**

1. My name is Alison Kate Saxby and I am a Licensing Officer in the Licensing Section of the Humberside Police based at Cromwell Road Police Station, Grimsby. I cover the county of North East Lincolnshire. I am under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police ('the Chief Constable'). My duties include consideration of the impact of crime and disorder and the Chief Constable's response to licensing matters.
2. I have been a Licensing Officer since January 2010, prior to which I was a Finance Assistant for 4 years, a Public Service Officer for 2 years and an Anti Social Behaviour Researcher for 2 ½ years. I have worked for Humberside Police for over 14 years, and I am familiar with problems of alcohol related crime and disorder in both in my current and previous roles. I hold a BIIAB Alcohol Practitioner qualification.
3. PAPANOM&CHUTNEY LIMITED, is the applicant for the Premises Licence application Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003 ('the Act') in respect of the premises known as Spice of Life, situated at 8-12 Wellowgate, Grimsby, North East Lincolnshire.

4. I make this statement in support of the Chief Constable's Objection to the application for a new Premises Licence under Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 and is in addition to those papers already served on the authority. The information in this statement is either within my personal knowledge or is taken from files maintained by the Chief Constable.

### **Background**

5. The Applicant applied for a New Premises Licence on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024.
6. The premises in question is situated in a retail and residential area in Grimsby. Other retail premises nearby include café's, takeaways, tattoo parlour, hotel, along with other local trader stores. It is close to the Town Centre. **(EXHIBIT AKS/01)**
7. The premises has previously held a Licence, PM000228. It permitted the sale of alcohol and Late Night Refreshment on Sunday to Thursday 1200hrs to 1400hrs and 1700hrs to 0100hrs, and on Friday and Saturday 1200hrs to 1400hrs and 1700hrs to 0200hrs. There was a Non Standard timing for Christmas Day which allowed licensable activity from 1200hrs to 1730hrs. **(EXHIBIT AKS/02)**
8. This licenced lapsed after the Premises Licence Holder's business, ELACHI GRIMSBY LIMITED, was dissolved on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2023 and no transfer was received to reinstate the licence. **(EXHIBIT AKS/03)**

### **History**

9. On 29<sup>th</sup> January 2024, the police were made aware from the council that the Spice of Life no longer held a Premises Licence. This information came to light due to an email being received from Immigration following a recent visit to the premises.

10. On 19<sup>th</sup> January 2024, Immigration officers attended the premises to conduct a further Immigration check. One male was arrested on suspicion of working in breach of his work visa. His visa allowed him to work in the care industry only, however he had been working as a waiter at the premises. His work visa was cancelled with immediate effect.
11. A second male was seen to remove his waiters uniform and escape from the premises.
12. Due to the arrest, a Referral Notice was served upon the manager, [REDACTED] advising he may be liable to a Civil Penalty for employing the illegal worker, with the decision remaining under consideration. **(EXHIBIT AKS/04)**
13. When Immigration advised the Council of the visit, a check was completed on the Premises Licence Holder of the business, which was a business – ELACHI GRIMSBY LIMITED. A Companies House check confirmed that the company was dissolved on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
14. When a company dissolves, the licence lapses. There is a 28 day timescale to “renew” the licence, however no application was received, and no information was passed to the Council at the time the business was dissolved.
15. Due to this, the premises has been operating without a Premises Licence, conducting Licensable Activity, since 31<sup>st</sup> May 2023.
16. The council made the Licensing Consultant that has been used by the premises for previous applications aware of the situation. The following day, the Council Licensing Team received a call from [REDACTED] to discuss the Licence, as he said it was his business. It was explained by the Council Licensing officer that no licensable activity should take place at the venue until the relevant issue had been resolved.

17. The premises had also, on the 25<sup>th</sup> January 2024, been advised that their licence had been suspended. This was due to a non-payment of the annual maintenance fee, which had been due on 17 August 2023. The same consultant had been emailed with a suspension letter. On the same day this was sent, [REDACTED] contacted the Council to discuss the premises, and paid the invoice. The payment was taken on the 29<sup>th</sup> January 2024, prior to the other issue being identified. **(EXHIBIT AKS/05)**
18. Temporary Event Notices were then submitted by the Licensing Consultant on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2024. These were for the dates 08-11<sup>th</sup> February 2024, 13-18<sup>th</sup> February 2024, 20-25<sup>th</sup> February 2024 and 27<sup>th</sup> February – 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2024. These were all submitted in the name of Mohammed Abdul SALIQUE. **(EXHIBIT AKS/06)**
19. On 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024, the application was received for a new premises. The DPS was listed as being Mohammed Abdul SALIQUE. Mr SALIQUE was previously the DPS at the premises from 2005 until January 2021, and he was also jointly the Premises Licence Holder until the same time, however the other party believed he had been taken off the licence a long time ago and the business was solely in SALIQUE's name.
20. The applications to remove him from the licence were submitted at the time due to a review being submitted after a previous visit by Immigration to the premises where illegal workers were located.
21. The Premises Licence Holder was listed as PAPADOM&CHUTNEY LIMITED. Companies House show there is 1 company Director, Lovely Begum HUSSAIN. This is the same company director that was on the licence when the licence lapsed – the company was ELACHI GRIMSBY LIMITED.
22. ELACHI GRIMSBY LIMITED applied to be the PLH on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2021, with Thillainathan NIROSHAN as the Director. This was then

changed on 10<sup>th</sup> February 2022 to Mohammed Hussain SHAHIR, until the current director took over. SHAHIR was her Sponsor on the Indefinite leave to Remain Application, which was accepted in 2010. She is listed as a Housewife on Companies House. It is not known what involvement, if any, she has with the business.

23. On 6<sup>th</sup> February 2024, a local PCSO was doing a routine patrol of the area, and passed the premises at 17:35hrs. It was noticed that a couple were sat in the front window and there was an empty used pint glass on the table, along with a bottled beer containing a lemon/lime wedge. This was reported back to Licensing, due to the premises not holding a licence or a TEN for that date.
24. Due to this a test purchase was carried out at the premises. This visit took place on 26<sup>th</sup> February 2024.
25. The officers conducting the visit entered at 18:00hrs and saw 5 staff, including a delivery driver, in the bar area. They were greeted by a male who showed them to a table and asked if they would like a drink. When asked where a drinks menu was, the male gestured to the menu he had given them. No mention was made that alcohol was not to be served that day, and the menu was still visible. Various types of alcohol were listed in the menu, and both officers ordered a pint of Cobra.
26. The member of staff went to the bar and advised a male that was behind the bar of the order. The barman pulled the pints from a pump, which was witnessed by the officers, and the waiter delivered them to the table.
27. At this point, the officers asked to speak to the person in charge. [REDACTED] came over to speak and the officers identified themselves as Police Officers. He provided his details, but without being questioned further, he blamed the staff and stated they knew not to give alcohol on a Monday.

28. The male that took the order shouted across that he had only started the week before. ██████ stated that the male should have been told not to sell alcohol. It is clear that ██████ was aware that alcohol shouldn't be served, however the pumps were all switched on and uncovered to sell alcohol. There did not appear to be any signage to advise no alcohol should be served.
29. All 3 males were spoken to. The waiter provided his details as ██████  
████████████████████ The barman identified himself as Mohammed RANA.
30. RANA also tried to blame the waiter, saying he was new and didn't know not to serve alcohol. He queried why he had to give his details, and he was advised it was because he was seen to pour the pints for service, hence committing the offence. This is being looked at separately under S136 of the Licensing Act.
31. The staff were advised that the pints were not being drunk, and ██████ walked away complaining the officers had "wasted two pints". **(EXHIBIT AKS/07)**
32. On the same day, the website for the premises was still advertising alcohol for sale for online ordering, despite the fact that there is no permission to do so. **(EXHIBIT AKS/08)**
33. The online menu is still advertising alcohol as of 20<sup>th</sup> March 2024, despite no alcohol sales being allowed since 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2024. **(EXHIBIT AKS/09)**
34. The premises has previously been reviewed due to concerns regarding breaching Immigration laws. The visit was conducted on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2019, and 2 people ran out the back of the building. Both were arrested by Immigration officers and found to be working in breach of the relevant visas.

35. When officers attended, the manager stated he was the son of the owner, believed to be [REDACTED]. The manager displayed behaviour that was described as verbally aggressive in order to intimidate and prevent officers from doing their job. A delivery driver also blocked the officers from leaving and had also been described as displaying extremely angry and aggressive body language.
36. Similar behaviour was displayed upon the paperwork being given to the premises on this occasion by the Council and the Police. A male, who identified himself as the owner, became argumentative and dismissive of officers before leaving, then ringing up a member of staff speaking to the officers, continuing in an abusive tone and told officers to leave.
37. Previous to this, Immigration had received previous intelligence on a number of occasions since 2008 and had made arrests on 2 other visits to the premises in 2012 and 2015. It was noted that verbal aggression was shown by the owners son on these visits too.
38. An application to vary the DPS and transfer the licence were both submitted, objected to and approved by Committee. It is clear from Companies House records that this transfer was not as it was purported to be, to a company away from the business. The business was Tale & Spirit Group Limited, which was running a business operated by [REDACTED] on Sea View Street, having been transferred in February 2020. At the point of the transfer, another male was on as director, however a few short months after the Committee decision, SALIQUE was made the Director, and subsequently JAKIR for a short amount of time. It is interesting to note that the change in directors happened after a transfer had been put in for this premises to ELACHI GRIMSBY LIMITED.
39. An application to vary the DPS was also put in at the same time as the transfer, in December 2020, which requested Mohammed ALI

RANA to be the DPS at the premises. This was accepted by Humberside Police.

40. In the decision letter provided after the review, the committee indicated that if we had not agreed the Vary DPS application, they would have requested his removal as the DPS. **(EXHIBIT AKS/10)**
41. ALI RANA is the same male that poured the drinks on the visit by officers on 26<sup>th</sup> February, and had the licence not lapsed, he would have still been the DPS at the premises, therefore he would have known the legislation and would have been aware that he was committing an offence and undermining the Licensing Objectives. He would have been DPS for over 3 years at the point of these offences.
42. Under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (revised Guidance April 2018), section 2 refers to the Licensing Objectives, starting with Crime and Disorder. Subsection 2.6 specifies "The prevention of crime includes the prevention of immigration crime including the prevention of illegal working in licenced premises. Licensing Authorities should work with Home Office Immigration Enforcement, as well as the police, in respect of these matters". It then goes on to explain about possible conditions to be place don the licence. In this case, this has already been done and has had no effect. This continued behaviour, for a fourth Immigration offence, is a clear undermining of the Licencing Objective.
43. Subsection 11.27 refers to certain criminal activity in a licenced premises that should be treated particularly seriously, one of which is for employing a person who is disqualified that from that work by reason of their immigration status in the UK.
44. It goes on further, in 11.28 to state that if it is determined that the crime prevention objective is undermined, it is expected that



revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered. This is the fourth offence.

45. Business owners should be aware of the relevant checks to conduct to ensure that anyone working in a premises is allowed to under Government Regulations and Legislation. This includes Right to Work checks. Despite extra licensing conditions being placed on the licence by Committee members to ensure that Illegal workers weren't found again, and a warning in the decision letter stating "The Sub-Committee hoped that the business would be run in accordance with the promotion of the licensing objectives", the premises continues to breach numerous parts of legislation that needs to be abided by.
46. The Impact assessment from The Home Office for the Introduction of an Immigration Check to Alcohol and Late Night Refreshment Licence Application states that illegal working often results in abusive and exploitative behaviour, tax evasion, undercutting legitimate business and adverse impacts on the employment of lawful workers.

### **Submissions**

47. The view of the Chief Constable is that the Premises has had a number of chances to run the premises in a correct way, the most recent time in 2020. The premises has never changed hands, despite transfers to seemingly independent people.
48. This is very much a family restaurant, which is run by SALIQUE, with his son ██████ managing the premises. His other son, ██████ has also stated to the Council Licensing team that he should be spoken to regarding the premises, so clearly has some involvement in the

business. There is no intention of the business being sold to any other party – the family will continue to operate the business.

49. They have been visited by Immigration officials on 4 occasions and there have been illegal workers found on each occasion.
50. At the previous Licensing Hearing, the Committee stated they would have removed SALIQUE as the DPS if it hadn't already been varied to someone else. It is difficult to see how he should be allowed to be the DPS now, given there are still the same concerns and the same parties involved in the business.
51. They have had alcohol set up on a day where there should be no service of alcohol, and staff did not advise that there was no alcohol to be served. It appears they were taking the chance and were caught out. The person who was seen to pour the alcohol is experienced enough to understand the seriousness of the offence. The manager has also been at the premises long enough to understand what should and shouldn't be done at the premises. He was also aware that alcohol shouldn't be served but put nothing in place to ensure that alcohol wasn't served when there was no authorisation in place.
52. Humberside Police cannot be confident that the premises will run the premises in the manner it should be, with staff that are entitled to work there and under any rules imposed on the licence. The Police cannot be convinced that anyone else that is placed on the licence is independent to the family and they would only be on in name and not have anything to do with the business.
53. It is the view of the Chief Constable that should the licence be granted, the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and other objectives of the Licensing Act 2003 will continue to be undermined.

54. The Chief Constable requests that the Licensing Committee consider the points made within this statement and asks that they refuse this application.

# Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions for premises licences and club premises certificates (Conditions 1 & 2 do not apply to clubs)

## Premises licensed to sell or supply alcohol for consumption ON the premises

**MC1.** No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

**MC2.** Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

**MC3.**

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

**MC4.** The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

**MC5.**

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. (Not clubs)

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

**MC6.** The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

**MC7.**

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula-  $P = D + (D \times V)$

Where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).

#### **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- CCTV cameras shall be installed at the premises
- During private functions held at the premises, management and staff shall control the music volume so as to prevent noise nuisance
- Children shall be admitted entrance to the premises when accompanied by an adult

#### **Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority**

- The premises licence holder will operate a full Human Resources (HR) management system, where all relevant documents are stored for each individual member of staff.
- All copies of relevant documents for members of staff will be retained for a period of 24 months post termination of employment, and will be made available to Police, Immigration, or Licensing Officers upon request.
- The premises licence holder will carry out checks on the Home Office website and verify identification documents, such as right to work, to ensure all new members of staff can be legally employed.
- No member of staff shall be able to work at the premises unless they have provided satisfactory proof of identification and right to work.

I am an Immigration Officer currently employed at the Home Office. I am based with the Yorkshire and Humberside Immigration, Compliance and Enforcement team. Part of my duties involve responding to Intelligence to identify persons in the UK illegally and those seeking to abuse UK Immigration Law.

On 14 February 2024 I was contacted by Alison Saxby, Licensing Officer from Humberside Police regarding a visit that Immigration Officers conducted to Spice of Life Restaurant, 8-12 Wellowgate, Grimsby DN32 0RA on 19 January 2024 investigating an allegation that the restaurant was employing illegal workers. I am making this statement following a request from Officer Saxby as it may be used in connection with a new Premises Licence application made by the above business.

I can confirm that Immigration Officers attended the above business on 19 January 2024 and arrested one male from Bangladesh on suspicion of working in breach of his work visa. He was taken to custody and subsequently served with a notice informing him that he had breached the conditions of his work visa; by working at the restaurant as a waiter rather than in the care industry for which his visa had been issued for. His work visa was cancelled with immediate effect.

As a result of the male being arrested at the restaurant, a Referral Notice was served on the manager [redacted] notifying him that he may be liable to a Civil Penalty of up to £20,000 for employing the illegal worker. This matter is now being dealt with by the Civil Penalties Compliance Team within the Home Office and remains under consideration.

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**STATEMENT OF  
JO BENNETT, NELC LICENSING OFFICER**

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**Introduction**

1. My name is Jo Bennett and I am a Licensing Officer in the Licensing Section of North East Lincolnshire Council based at Doughty Road, Grimsby. I cover the area of Grimsby in North East Lincolnshire.
  
2. I have been a Licensing Officer since November 2018, I am therefore familiar with problems of alcohol related crime and disorder, and aware of the impact of licensed premises used in criminality.
  
3. I make this statement in support of Humberside Police's objection application, for the premises licence at Spice of Life, 8-12 Wellowgate, Grimsby, DN32 0RA, under Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003. The information in this statement is either within my personal knowledge or is taken from files maintained by North East Lincolnshire Council.
  
4. Prior to the current application, The Spice of Life had a premises licence under the name of Elachi Grimsby Ltd. North East Lincolnshire Council had an outstanding invoice from 17 August 2023 for the annual maintenance fee, so on 25 January 2024, I emailed [REDACTED] (Licensing Agent) a copy of the outstanding invoice along with a suspension letter. On the same day, I received an email from our admin team to say that [REDACTED] from Spice of Life wanted to speak to me to pay the invoice. I couldn't contact [REDACTED] on the Thursday so spoke to him the following Monday, he paid the invoice and advised me that he was doing so as his brother wasn't as good at speaking as he was.



5. On 29 January 2024, [REDACTED] from Immigration contacted me to advise that a visit had been made to Spice of Life to do an immigration check and one male was found working in breach of his conditions. This prompted me to do further checks around the premises licence and on checking Elachi Grimsby Ltd on Companies House, it became apparent that Elachi Grimsby Ltd dissolved 30 May 2023, which meant that the premises licence for the Spice of Life had lapsed. I again emailed [REDACTED] to advise of the situation and that, as the premises no longer held a premises licence, it should cease all licensable activities forthwith. [REDACTED] confirmed 30 January that he had informed "them" and he requested a plan of the premises for when an application was made.
6. On 30 January, I had a telephone call from [REDACTED], querying why I had contacted [REDACTED] with regards to the premises licence for Spice of Life. I explained that we did not have a contact number/contact name for the licence holder and that [REDACTED] had always dealt with any matters with regards to The Spice of Life, i.e. applications, temporary event notices. Following [REDACTED] request I then emailed information with regards to applying for a new premises licence and temporary events notices to him at [REDACTED]



I am Police Inspector [REDACTED] of the Humberside Police currently stationed at [REDACTED] in the Community Safety Unit.

As part of my role I have ownership of the alcohol licensing team for the force.

On Monday 26th February 2024 at around 18.00 hours as the result of information received within the team I attended at a premises called THE SPICE OF LIFE 8-12 WELLOWGATE in Grimsby.

At that time I was on duty in civilian clothes and in the company with PS [REDACTED] also in civilian clothes.

The premises had no diners in and around five staff that we saw including a delivery driver in the bar area.

When we entered we were greeted by a male who showed us to a table and gave us the menus and then asked if we would like a drink.

I asked if there was a drinks menu and he said yes it is in there and gestured to the menu in my hand. I could see that there was various different types of alcohol listed in the menu and PS BRAGG then asked for a pint of Cobra and I said I would have the same.

The staff member went over to the bar area and placed the order with a male who later identified himself as Mohammed RANA [REDACTED]

RANA then pulled the drinks from the pumps on the bar and the other member of staff brought the drinks over and placed them on the table.

I took a photo of the drinks which I can identify as exhibit STJ1 on my job issued mobile phone. I asked if I could speak with the person in charge and a male who identified himself as [REDACTED] came to speak.

I was satisfied with his identity by the information we already had in our briefing. I introduced myself and PS [REDACTED] to him and straight away he said "IT'S THE STAFF FAULT THEY KNEW NOT TO GIVE ALCOHOL ON A MONDAY".

I explained that he would be interviewed at a later date.

As PS [REDACTED] obtained the original member of staffs details I spoke with RANA.

RANA was blaming the staff member also stating he is new and didn't know not to serve alcohol.

I then asked RANA for his details which he gave as above and stated he did not have ID so I asked if he consented to a photograph which he said he did and I can identify this as exhibit STJ2.

RANA asked why I wanted his details and I said it was because he pulled the pints. He then obliged. The alcohol was not touched by us and the staff were told this.

██████████ picked up the glasses and took them from the table complaining that we had "wasted two pints." We then left stating that we would be in touch.

I am Police Sergeant [REDACTED] of HUMBERSIDE POLICE, currently based at [REDACTED] POLICE STATION. [REDACTED] My current role is a Community Safety Sergeant within the COMMUNITY SAFETY UNIT

Part of my role involves supporting other areas of policing within our unit, including Licencing enforcement.

On Monday 26th February 2024 at around 17:55 hours, I attended THE SPICE OF LIFE, 8-12 WELLOWGATE GRIMSBY, DN32 ORY. I attended the location in company with Police Inspector [REDACTED] following some information received within the Licencing Team.

At that time, we were on duty in civilian clothing. The premises is a restaurant, which was open to the public and had no customers inside. Upon entering, it was clean and tidy, and most tables were set for diners including what I would describe to be upturned Wine Glasses.

As you enter the premises from the road, there is a bar to the right-hand side and seating throughout. The bar itself was substantial in that it had beer pumps, optics and a variety of fridges containing alcohol.

There were four members of staff, three of which were male and one female. There also appeared to be a fourth male that appeared to be a delivery driver. I got this impression due to the fact they were in casual clothing and were speaking with the restaurant staff as though they knew one another.

Having entered the premises, we were greeted by a member of staff who I now know to be called [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] They accompanied us to a table and offered the menu for us to look at.

Having provided the menu, [REDACTED] asked whether he could get us a drink. We asked if there was a drinks menu and they explained it was towards the back of the menu. I therefore ordered a pint of COBRA, which is a lager containing alcohol. Shortly afterwards Inspector [REDACTED] ordered the same. Whilst the beverages were being prepared I continued to view the menu. However, I did see that [REDACTED] had requested the drinks from a male member of staff standing behind the bar, who subsequently pulled them from the draught pump. A short time afterwards [REDACTED] brought the drinks to our table. I can confirm that the beverage served was the colour I would expect a pint of lager to look like was carbonated and had the "head" that would be present in a draught pulled pint of lager.

Upon receipt of the beverages, [REDACTED] asked if we were ready to order food. Inspector [REDACTED] confirmed that we were. [REDACTED] walked away, and a second member of staff came to take our order. It was at this point that Inspector [REDACTED] requested to speak to the person in charge. The second member of staff explained that the person in charge was out the back and asked whether there was anything they could help with. Inspector [REDACTED] explained that there was nothing to worry about and that we wished to speak with the person in charge.

There was a short delay and a male presenting themselves as the person in charge came over to our table. At this point Inspector [REDACTED] and I stood up from our seats and introduced ourselves as Police Officers, working as part of the Licencing Team. The male identified themselves to be [REDACTED]



DOB [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] They also provided their telephone number as [REDACTED].

Without saying anything further [REDACTED] said "THEY SHOULDN'T HAVE SOLD ITT YOU" referring to the two pints of COBRA that were on our table. At this point [REDACTED] shouted across "I STARTED LAST WEEK". They were approximately 10 metres away from us. It was clear that [REDACTED] was aware that the Temporary Event Notice held at the premises did not include Mondays. [REDACTED] also said that [REDACTED] should have been told and that we shouldn't have been served alcohol.

Having held this very brief discussion, Inspector [REDACTED] explained to [REDACTED] that they would be required to attend a voluntary interview regarding the matter. [REDACTED] understood and it was explained that this would be arranged in due course. [REDACTED] was also instructed not to sell any more alcohol other than during the stipulated times on the Temporary Event Notice. [REDACTED] acknowledged the instruction.

It was at this point that [REDACTED]'s full details were recorded along with those of [REDACTED]. I can produce the following Police Exhibits:

**RE: Application to Review a Premises Licence – Spice of Life  
Licensing Sub Committee, 20<sup>th</sup> January 2021**

Following the application of The Home Office Immigration Enforcement for a review of the Premises Licence in respect of the premises known as "Spice of Life", 8-12 Wellowgate, Grimsby, the Licensing Sub Committee sitting on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2021 resolved to attach additional conditions to the Premises Licence.

The Sub-Committee carefully considered all information, both written and oral, submitted by each party; The Home Office Immigration Enforcement, Humberside Police and the Premises Licence Holder.

The Sub-Committee were happy that there should be no slur on the character of the Premises Licence Holder, Mr Mohammed Abdul Salique, regarding the illegal working found to have occurred on the premises known as the 'Spice of Life'. However, the Sub-Committee showed their concern that in appointing his son as manager, Mr Salique could, and should, have made regular checks to ensure licensing law was being complied with.

Having checked with the authorities, the Sub-Committee noted that the DPS variation had been successful. Had that not have happened, the Sub-Committee would have sought to remove Mr Salique as DPS.

The Sub-Committee had regard to the time the proceedings had taken, noting that the subject premises were now being operated by Tale and Spirit Group Limited and had been since December 2020.

The Sub-Committee hoped that the business would be run in accordance with the promotion of the licensing objectives. In order to facilitate this, and provide assurance, the Sub-Committee insisted on the following conditions to be added to the Premises Licence:

1. The premises licence holder will operate a full Human Resources (HR) management system, where all relevant documents are stored for each individual member of staff.

2. All copies of relevant documents for members of staff will be retained for a period of 24 months post termination of employment, and will be made available to Police, Immigration, or Licensing Officers upon request.
3. The premises licence holder will carry out checks on the Home Office website and verify identification documents, such as right to work, to ensure all new members of staff can be legally employed.
4. No member of staff shall be able to work at the premises unless they have provided satisfactory proof of identification and right to work.

The Sub-Committee determined that these conditions were both appropriate and proportionate to promote the licensing objectives.

The Sub-Committee also noted that there had been no further suggestions of crime and disorder issues at the premises, or any intelligence to suggest that illegal workers had been employed since the visit to the premises in August 2019.

The Sub-Committee read and heard all of the information before them. The Sub Committee is aware of, and has taken into account, any implications that may arise from the Human Rights Act 1998. The Sub-Committee in reaching its decision has had due regard for its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010 and consider that in reaching their decision, that they have had due regard for the duty placed upon them by s.149.

#### Rights of Appeal

Your attention is drawn to the Rights of Appeal as set out in Schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003. Where a Licensing Authority decides upon an application for review of a premises licence under section 52 of the Act, the applicant for the review, the Premises Licence Holder or any other person who made relevant representations may appeal against the decision.

An appeal must be commenced by Notice of Appeal given to the Justices' Chief Executive for the Magistrates Court within 21 days of this letter.

A determination under section 52 does not have effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.

#### Update of Licence

In order for the Licensing Authority to be able to discharge its functions to update the licence under section 56 of the Act, the Premises Licence Holder is required to produce the licence within 14 days for any appropriate amendments to be made. If, without reasonable excuse, the Premises Licence Holder fails to comply with the



request, he commits an offence punishable on summary conviction to a fine of up to £500.

Following the application of Tale & Spirit Group Limited for a transfer of the Premises Licence in respect of the premises known as “Spice of Life”, 8-12 Wellowgate, Grimsby, the Licensing Sub Committee sitting on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2021 resolved to approve the application, which took immediate effect from 1<sup>st</sup> December 2020.

The Sub-Committee carefully considered all information, both written and oral, submitted by both parties; the Premises Licence Holder and Humberside Police.

The sub-committee were happy to approve the transfer of the Premises Licence as laid out. However, they pointed out, having given the benefit of the doubt in this decision, they expected to have no further recurrence or breaches of the licensing objectives. They also re-iterated the power of review was available at any time and further transgression would not be looked upon as favourably by the authorities.

The Sub-Committee read and heard all of the information before them. The Sub Committee is aware of, and has taken into account, any implications that may arise from the Human Rights Act 1998. The Sub-Committee in reaching its decision has had due regard for its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010 and consider that in reaching their decision, that they have had due regard for the duty placed upon them by s.149.

**Rights of Appeal**

Your attention is drawn to the Rights of Appeal as set out in Schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003. Where a Licensing Authority decides upon an application to transfer a Premises Licence under section 44 of the Act, the Chief Officer of Police which gave notice under section 42(6) may appeal against the decision to grant the application.

An appeal must be commenced by Notice of Appeal given to the Justices' Chief Executive for the Magistrates Court within 21 days of this letter.
